1. Abuse of any animal or official will not be tolerated and will result in immediate disqualification and forfeiture of prizes.
2. Tielcey Park reserves the right to refuse any entry, alter or cancel the programme, combine classes or judging allocations, if necessary.
3. Tielcey Park reserve the right to randomly drug test any animal competing at the show.
4. Timings are approximate only – all classes will start promptly - please be ready to ride as soon as the steward calls the class.
5. The judge's decision is final – harassment of officials will not be tolerated and will result in immediate disqualification and barring from all Tielcey Park competitions for one year.
6. **Entry Fee** all classes - \$6 per class.
7. **Ribbons** to 6th in all classes. Prizes may also be given.
8. **Show levy** \$10/horse; non refundable in event of scratching.
9. **Accommodation:** Yards \$10/night and day, day yards only - \$5/day, superb stabling \$20/day and night; overnight camping (includes showers and toilets) \$5/person – max \$15/truck/float/tent - please state dates required on entry form.

10. Late entries - if accepted – will incur a late entry fee of \$10.
11. Any **protests** must be submitted in writing along with a \$50 protest fee. The secretary's decision is final and this fee is non refundable.
12. For the safety of horses and as we have limited parking, all parking will be allocated. Ensure you state the vehicle type and registration and date arriving. To ensure all vehicles are able to park on the grounds and for the safety of competitors and spectators, we do not allow horses and ponies to be tied to trucks or floats in these Parking Areas: Small Arena, Main Yards, New Carpark. Parking in these areas will be allocated firstly to people booking a stable, then those in overnight yards. Please state preference for parking area on entry form.
13. Parking and stabling will be allocated by date of entry receipt. Please state float/truck size and license plate on entry form. If you are entering the Ashhurst Horse Sports on Waitangi Day, you may stay Sunday night, please pay another night's stabling/yarding and note on entry form.
14. Café will be closed how ever the seating is available. There will also be a sausage sizzle and coffee available from C ME 4 COFFEE.
15. Please include email address with your entries and check our website www.tielceypark.co.nz from the Wednesday before the show for your free programme; enclose SSAE plus \$3 for programme if no internet access.

17. **Scratchings**: Refund of full accommodation costs and entry fees if scratched by phone or email by Friday 23rd March 7pm AND confirmed in writing accompanied by doctor and/or veterinary/other equine practitioner certificate within one week after event. Show levy is non refundable.
18. Tielcey Park disclaims all liability for, and will not be responsible for, any accident, loss or damage to animals, people or property.
19. **No Dogs on grounds – please leave them at home.**

Show Overview

Tielcey Park's goal is to run a super duper show for true pleasure horses and ponies, so that everybody attending has a great day out and **enjoys** their horses and ponies. That is after all why we ride... for pleasure!

This show has been organised for fun. If you are not having fun you will be cheered up by competitors and organisers! 😊 Please report anybody not having fun... the fun committee will do their best to cheer them up. 😊 Please support your fellow riders, we don't offer prize money – you can win donated prizes and ribbons – but mainly it's about celebrating the joy of riding such a lovely horse or pony. Ribbons may be bought from the secretary for \$3 each if you miss out on a colour you really want.

Our aim is for everybody to take home lots of ribbons - we will guarantee everyone will go home with at least four ribbons. If you do not win four ribbons please come to the office after the show for your choice of ribbons (no charge 😊 for these.)

Show classes are split into age groups. We create the age groups after entries have closed to ensure classes have similar numbers, and it is fairer for everyone.

Spot Prizes

Not everyone can come away with an arm-full of ribbons – so we have lots of spot prizes available. These will be given at the steward's, judges' and secretary's discretion.

Definitions

A “pleasure mount” is ...

... those animals who do not fit the mould of a Show Horse/Pony. We welcome any breed (e.g. Appaloosas, Quarter Horses, Standardbreds, Clyde X) and colour. They should be an uncomplicated ride and a genuine pleasure to ride. Whilst they might not have the beauty queen conformation of a show horse, they should in their own way be a delight to ride.

... those animals who have never been placed first, second or third in an open class at a Horse of the Year Qualifying Show where Pleasure classes are offered. An open class is defined as any class (other than Pleasure Horse classes) which are not restricted to breed type (for example, Show Hack, Saddle Hunter, Show Pony, Saddle Hunter Pony). So if you have placings in Pleasure Horse classes you can enter, and if you have placings in open classes (e.g. Saddle hunter) at a show where Pleasure Horse classes were NOT offered – you can enter.

A “pleasure mount” is NOT...

... an inexperienced mount with good conformation who is destined for the show ring at some later date - but needs more experience to be competitive in the show ring.

A “mount” is a pleasure horse or pony. They must be an equine – ie. No fathers, donkeys, mules, goats or sheep (sorry ☺).

Rider’s Age is as at date of show – 25th March 2012.

Riders on Horses and Ponies

We welcome adults on horses and children on ponies – adults on ponies and children on horses. That is, you may ride which ever mount is pleasurable for *you* to ride!

Attire

This is a no plaiting and no jackets show. Wear tidy, clean attire and ensure your horse is in good condition and clean. Your turnout will NOT be judged except in the best groomed class.

Equipment

Snaffle bridles only, no whips, no spurs – on penalty of elimination.

Leg boots and hoof boots may be worn. Bandages may be worn with permission of the judge (in event of injury). Bitless bridles may be used. Rope halters may be used. Nose nets may be used.

Elimination

Riders who compete their horse knowing they have contravened the rules of the show may be eliminated at the secretary's discretion.

These include those adjudged to be suitable as A&P level show hacks/hunters/show riding horses/show ponies/saddle ponies/lead-rein.

A protest may be made by a judge, a participant, or an observer and must be accompanied by a \$20 fee, which is non refundable.

The steward will investigate the protest and advise the secretary of the result of this investigation. The secretary will then make their decision known.

The secretary's decision is final and no discussion with any party will be considered after this decision is made.

Best Pleasure Mount

The winner of each ring's Best Pleasure Mount will be decided by adding the number of placings received in this ring. The winner is the mount with the highest total score.

1st place = 6 points
2nd place = 5 points
3rd place = 4 points
4th place = 3 points
5th place = 2 points
6th place = 1 point

In the event of a tie for first or second - the higher placed mount will be decided by the higher number of placings gained at first, second, third... etc down to sixth placing. If this still does not produce a leader, the highest placing gained in the "best combination" class will be used to produce a leader.

Entries will be split into age group classes, which will be decided after entries close to ensure we have similar numbers of entries in each grouping.

The winner of each ring's Best Pleasure Mount will receive a sash.

The Rider Who Has The Most Fun

This is a special event – not to be entered. A secret judge will observe the rings and award prizes to the top six riders.

The winner of The Rider Who Has The Most Fun will receive:

- A sash
- A cotton show rug

Those riders placing second to sixth will be given ribbons

Best Barefoot Mount

The winner of the Best Barefoot Mount will be decided by adding the number of placings received in the show – points as for the Best Pleasure Mount. The winner is the mount with the highest total score. Mounts must be nominated as barefoot (ie. Not shod with shoes) on the entry form or on show day.

The mount with the highest total score will receive:

- A trophy – yours to keep for the year
- A miniature of the trophy - yours to keep forever
- A sash

Best Pleasure Mount Judging Procedure

Winners of Best Pleasure Mount in each ring will be brought together and judged by all the judges. The judges will stand in separate corners of the ring and not confer. They will allocate marks to each mount and these will be added by the secretary. The winner is the combination with the highest total score – the Best National Pleasure Mount.

The winner will receive:

- A trophy – yours to keep for the year.
- A miniature of the trophy - yours to keep forever
- A sash

Judges names will be announced nearer the Show

Best Pleasure Mount Team Event Conditions

Nominated teams of four riders - one of which must be a child 12 years and under.

Riders compete on the day in their individual events, and for each team the top three riders placings count towards the team event. In the event of a tie for first, second or third - the higher placed team will be decided by the higher number of placings gained at first, second, third... etc down to sixth placing. If this still does not produce a leader, the highest team members placings gained in their rider classes will be used.

Entry Fee: \$20 per team plus individual class entry fees

If you do not have enough members for a team, or wish to ride in a team but don't know enough people – please contact us, we will match up people who wish to ride in a team.

The presentation for medals will be on a podium with the winning team's theme song to be played after the medals are presented (just like the Olympics!). Please provide a CD of your team's theme song on show day – all will be played throughout the show.

The winning team will receive:

- A trophy – the team's to keep for the year
- Four miniature trophies – one for each team member - yours to keep forever
- Individual Gold Medals for each team member

The second placed team will receive:

- Individual Silver Medals for each team member

The third placed team will receive:

- Individual Bronze Medals for each team member

Fancy Dress Event Conditions

The theme this year is “Heroes” – dress up your mount and rider in your best interpretation for great prizes. Spot prizes will be given in this ring as well as ribbons first to sixth. All four judges will judge the fancy dress competition.

The winner will receive:

- A trophy – yours to keep for the year.
- A miniature of the trophy - yours to keep forever
- A sash

Photographers

We are in the process of commissioning three photographers for this event so each ring will get photos. Please support them by purchasing photographs – this means we will be able to offer this service in future.

IN-HAND CLASSES – 9am START

To be led without a saddle. Entries do not have to be entered in the ridden classes. Mounts will not be judged on conformation.

- 1 Best groomed mount - to be judged on the most "natural" looking, clean and best presented mount
 - 2 Most obedient mount
 - 3 Most skilled handler
 - 4 Best mover

Following these classes there will be a break to allow saddling.

Ridden Classes

Riders may be led on their mounts by a handler if lacking confidence or for the safety of themselves and other riders. Judges will have discretion as to how to judge these mounts.

- 5 Best halted mount
- 6 Best walking mount
- 7 Best trotting mount
- 8 Best cantering mount
- 9 Mount with the best manners
- 10 Mount most suitable for a beginner
- 11 Mount most suitable for jumping (with a maximum of two small jumps)
- 12 Mount most suitable for dressage
- 13 Mount most suitable for trekking and farm work
- 14 Best rider
- 15 Best combination of rider and mount
- 16 Best pair of pleasure mounts

A consolation class will be run for riders who have not won a ribbon. No entry fee.

Following these classes there will be a break while results are calculated. Then the Best Pleasure Mount sash will be awarded.
