Tiger is out of a full sister to legendary SUPER MOTH who won 44 Grand Prix and more than \$92,000. An attractive grey stallion, he is a lovely mover, good natured and has a powerful jump. He has 3 crops of foals on the ground & they are all lovely types.

Bloodline Notes

DISTELFINK is NZ's top ever SJ Sire with over 140 winners and many champions in all disciplines! TRIBUNE is by TRIC TRAC a sire who produce top showjumpers including NATIONWIDE (twice Horse of the Year winner); MR KINCAID and top eventer KIWI (Austr).

TIGER MOTH represents some of the country's top bloodlines through DISTELFINK and his sire TRIBUNE (sire of 10cc LS and TOUCH OF GRAY LS jumping with the Steiner team). His dam DILEMMA is a full sister to SUPER MOTH (see below) and was in fact a very good jumper herself. She was retained at stud and has produced naturally impressive jumpers with outstanding movement. Being 3/4 TB, TIGER MOTH is being used by discerning event riders as a cross for their mares to bring that touch of warmblood movement and power to their TB mix. His foals to date are exceptional.

SUPER MOTH was bought by John Cottle as a 7 year old and prior to that he had been a dressage horse. He won a total of 75 showjumping classes, with 44 at Grand Prix level. He once won 10 GP's in a row. He won close to \$92,000. He was NZ Showjumper of the Year 4 years in a row. He was Horse of the Year in 1998, National Champion in 1999 and won the North Island Championship twice. He also won the Bell Tea GP at the Horse of the Year twice, the Norwood Gold Cup and the Wanganui Class twice in a row as well as the Auckland Easter Classic three times in succession. Super Moth and John Cottle are ranked third in the World Standing for the most World Cup wins on the same horse.
